View Tribute Book Jeffrey (DooDad) Joe Jeffers, 66, of Pearland, Texas, passed away on June 1, 2025, in Friendswood, Texas. A short memorial service will be held at the Houston National Cemetery at 10:30 AM on June 16, 2025, located at 10410 Veterans Memorial Drive (Lane 2), Houston, TX 77038. Jeffrey was born in Texas City, Texas, to Joe and Wynelle Jeffers on August 7, 1958. He attended Friendswood High School and graduated in 1976. Shortly after, he joined the United States Marine Corps, where he proudly served his country from 1976 to 1980 as an aircraft mechanic. After his military service, he continued his career as a grounds support equipment mechanic. Jeffrey loved soaking up the sun, whether he was fishing, golfing, or acting as the unofficial (and often very vocal) referee during lively family game nights. He had a sharp mind for chess, a ruthless Monopoly strategy, and a heart that always prioritized time with his grandchildren.
