Dombrowski, 68, passed away on Sunday, January 21, 2024, after a 3-year battle with cancer. He was at home, surrounded in the comfort of his family. Scott was born the middle son of three boys to Harold and Lillian Dombrowski in Chicago, Illinois, on February 10, 1955. Scott is preceded in death by his father, Harold Dombrowski.
