Clarence Joseph Lewis Sr. 84 passed away January 10th. He served as the Grand Knight (Council 5232), and held other offices in the 3rd degree (La Porte). He joined the 4th degree (Council 3700) while serving in various offices. Clarence sang in the Choir and served as a Eucharistic Minister. His vocational career spanned thirty-five years. He worked twenty-five years for United Texas Transmission Co., from which he retired. He also worked for LaPorte ISD and retired after over 12 years of service. Clarence has a gift for inspiring and motivating those around him through his random acts of kindness.
