While working in Bangalore, New Delhi, Calcutta, Poona and near Bombay he obtained professional licenses as Cost Accountant (India) and Chartered Secretary (Commonwealth). He came to US in 1972 and completed MBA at Northwestern State University of Louisiana. He obtained another professional license as CPA and was also admitted to Mensa.

After working in various corporations, he briefly tried running his own Accounting Practice. Jay is blessed with two children.
